On **Thursday, April 24**, RAGBRAI director T.J. Juskiewicz comes to our general meeting at the Coralville Public Library to fill us in on the route, plus other essential RAGBRAI stuff. Although T.J.'s talk begins at 7 p.m., plan to show up around 6:30 to snack on Barb Goff's famous pies and chat with friends.

## BIC BOARD MEETING MINUTES

**January 17, 2008**

Present: Rudin, Goff, Berkowitz, Loring, Maddix, Walton, Parrott, Doak

President Rudin: Brief recap of 2007. Good year. Looking forward to 2008. Work has begun on many BIC activities and changes. Will start calling for volunteers for the Criterium.

Vice Presidents Goff & Berkowitz: Holiday party was good. Participation down; many members unable to attend. Ideas for the party next year. Discussed Feb 27 General Meeting. Board members encouraged to attend meetings and events.

Treasurer Stewart (Absent): Report and distribution of financial tallies by Rudin. Finances are sound. Moneys from AHTCC (AMISH Century) to be transferred to Hills Bank.

Membership Cronk (Absent): New membership list generated with current addresses, although some are outdated. Membership list to be discussed at next meeting.

Touring Maddix: Alvin Miller has volunteered to lead Tuesday rides (Palmberg will no longer lead these). Maddix is developing innovations, such as cue sheets, contour maps, etc. Ride cancellations and other info are on the Website. Leaders will be contacted earlier if rides are cancelled. Leaders encouraged to contact Touring Director as to condition of roads, hazards or other problems. Regional ride leaders to be identified, that is those that live closer to ride starts. There is renewed interest in gravel road rides. Details yet to be determined. Maddix will do a survey of membership of various BIC activities.

RAGBRAI Parrott: Sign-ups at about 130. 155 is the maximum and Feb 1 is the deadline. Communication has been good with signees. There is interest in various services (tent set-up, showers, etc)

AHTCC: Chapleau has resigned; no replacement has been identified.

Editor Doak: Discussed the option of an electronic newsletter. Saves printing and mailing costs. Jerseys have sold well, still some available. BIC is close to break-even on jersey procurement and sales, which was the objective.

Education and Safety Loring: Bike to Work Week is being organized with BIC participation. Bike Summit is the end of this month in Des Moines; Wyatt is principle in this activity.

Publicity Copper (absent): BIC ride descriptions are again in the Gazette.

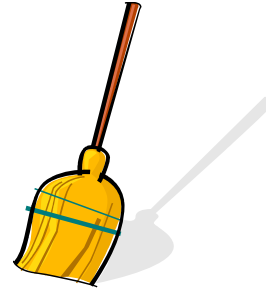
Webmaster Maddix: Web is continually being improved and frequently updated. Revised By-Laws to published on the Web soon.

Old business Rudin: Discussed and critiqued the amended and restated Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws; Berkowitz and Hahn performed this task. Minor changes, mostly in wording, were suggested and included. The changes will be on the Website for the membership. Voting will be at the next general meeting February 27, 2008.

New Business Rudin: BIC will help sponsor BTWW with a donation of \$500. We will do breakfast (Rudin, and Walton will help). May 12-16 is BTWweek. Discussed the possibility of an IC family event, such as a picnic in the late summer. BIC furnishes the meat, others bring a dish. There was general support, but no specifics yet.

## IOWA STATE ROAD RACING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Iowa State Road Race Championships will be held in West Branch on **August 2, 2008**. For the past several years this event had been hosted in Sherrill, Iowa (north of Dubuque) by the Chain Reaction Bicycle Club. This is a state championship event, meaning the top 3 Iowa riders for each category will win gold/silver/bronze medals and will be recognized as the 2008 Iowa state champions.

Hoover Days are scheduled in West Branch on August 2 also, so activities are being planned to promote both events.

The plan proposed by the Iowa City Cycling Club and G4 Sports Marketing is to have the race start in downtown West Branch, and head north on Downey Street out of town. It will proceed north and then turn east towards Cedar Bluff. They are considering a route that would actually go through Cedar Bluff and then rejoin up with the main highway to continue eastward until they get to X40, where they would turn south towards Buchanan. They would continue south through the Cedar Valley area and then turn back towards West Branch when they reach Springdale. The projected finish line for the race would be on the east side of West Branch. These routes are familiar to many BIC riders.

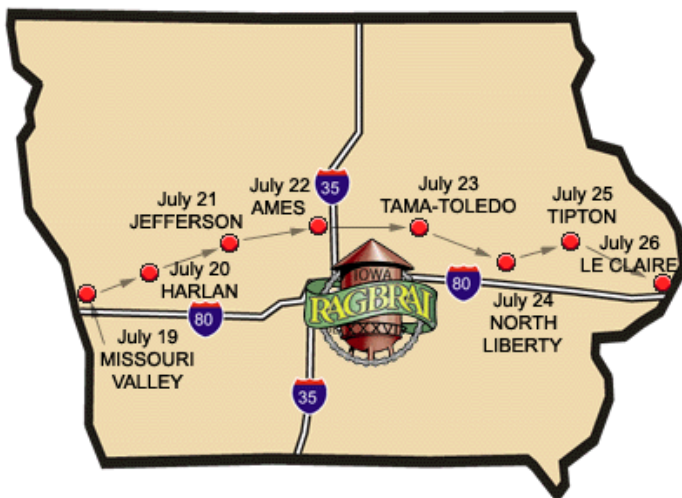
## RAGBRAI® NEWS!

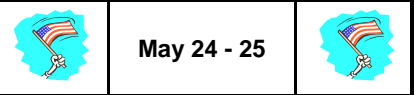

The 30 riders on the 2007 tour taxed accommodation and sag capacity. This year, a limit of 25 riders will enhance everyone's enjoyment. We expect to reach this limit early and advise quick action. Find the entry form in this newsletter.

The 2007 tour will ride ridges hugging the Mississippi River. The route follows the Great River Trail from Dickeyville to Cassville. Cassville offers a ferryboat and numerous taverns to accommodate passengers. Here, the route turns east toward Platteville, a University of Wisconsin town. After our famous wine and cheese party, bicyclists will find dinner in a town offering many choices.

On Sunday, we pass Belmont, the originally proposed state capital site, when Iowa, Minnesota, and other states were part of Wisconsin. From there, we will turn south towards lead mining country. Expect outstanding scenery as well as local color.

Bicyclists on last year's tour to Caledonia, Minnesota, thoroughly enjoyed the ride and camaraderie. **Once again, enjoy the adventure! Expect comfortable accommodations, lots of laughter, pleasant surroundings, and good food.** On Saturday, May 24, we will bicycle quiet country roads from Dickeyville, WI, to the Super 8 in Platteville, WI – a university town. Just as we did last year, we will bicycle the Driftless Area, a region the last glacier did not level flat like the surrounding plains. Expect similar hills and spectacular scenery.

### Meeting Places Saturday

We will have luggage transport, maps, cue sheets, and Sag support. We plan to depart from the North Liberty Community Center on Saturday **no later than 6:00 AM**. Dickeyville is on US-151 eight miles from the US-151 bridge, about 13/4-hour driving time. Information mailed in advance will aid in arranging carpools. Registrants will also receive a map of the meeting place in Dickeyville and route details to enhance enjoyment.

### Start on Time

Please plan to arrive in Dickeyville before 7:30 to unload your bikes. We will leave town at about 7:45. As noted, participants will receive detailed route plans a week prior to departure, **if applications are timely**. We will try to keep bicyclists in matched groups to facilitate sag support.

Bring a tolerance for nature's whims, a sense of adventure, and money for food. There will be space for a tiny bag in a Sag. Sags are emergency vehicles, not a personal taxi service, and all riders should be prepared to complete the distance they select. If the weather suggests a later start en route, alternative plans and maps will be available to cover all contingencies.

There are 16 BIC rooms reserved at the Super 8 in Platteville with special BIC rates of \$64 for a single double bed and \$71 for two double beds, tax included. The inn offers breakfast, but few other amenities. Because Platteville and Dickeyville are only about 11 miles apart, those who want to spend Friday night could stay two nights in the same motel. Be certain to ask about cancellation rules. Wisconsin is tough.

### Routes

There are cutoffs and extensions to provide mileage of choice. Saturday, we will start by dogging the Mississippi on the Great River Cycling Trail. Towns on the route include Cassville, notable for a ferry across the Mississippi. We plan to have our famous wine & cheese social shortly after bicycling into Platteville. Sunday's routes will use entirely different scenic roads. Highlights include Wisconsin's original capital near Belmont. Lead Mine has a population of a dozen badgers and six bars. New Diggings has a spectacular climb south towards Galena, but we will only look at the hill and continue west.

\* Incremental distances range from 7 to 10 miles.

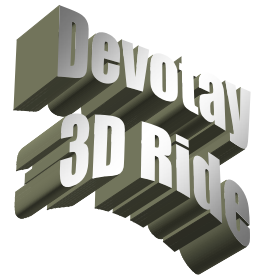
